For the year ended 31 March 2013**

Note 1: Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

This financial report is a special purpose report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporations Act. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historical costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted on preparation of this financial report.

a) Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, and other short –term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

b) Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument. Dividend revenue is recognised when the right to receive a dividend has been established.

Grant and donation income is recognised when the entity obtains control over the funds, which is generally at the time of receipt.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST)

c) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

The Association is not registered or required to be registered for GST

Congratulations to the clubs & athletes in the area who have competed at State & National level.

Congratulations also to the swimmers & coaches who have participated in the CVSA (the former Central Coast & Northern District) who represented Australia at London Olympic & Paralympic games and other representative teams.

Each year CVSA encourage clubs to apply to host the Summer & Winter championships, Summer Development meet & the Summer & Winter Speedo sprint series. We endeavour to give all clubs who apply to host these meets an equal share of hosting events. Details on how to host & what is required are available in the Information booklet on the Coast & Valley website. CVSA will continue to hold Area Championship at Woy Woy PLC. We feel this facility is the best outside of SOPAC & gives swimmers their best chance of achieving the times they may be chasing; it also provides the best spectator facilities.

Online entries were introduced and conducted in the area for the first time in 2012. This system appears to be well received by clubs, swimmers & parents who appear to be getting more acquainted with the system.

ANNUAL REPORT SEASON 2102/2013

It gives me pleasure to submit the annual report for the Area Technical Training Committee for the season 2012/2013. It has again been a busy year throughout the area with the number of swim meets within the area ever increasing which need to be manned by the officials which is taxing the resources of the area.

The technical committee would like to take this opportunity to thank those officials who give freely of their valuable time to man the meets in the Area, for without these officials swim meets could not be conducted in the professional and efficient manner that they are.

Training;

At the time of writing this report the number of new credentials that were attained for the period is as follows;

It is hoped that these new officials take up the task and attend swim meets that will further enhance their skills as a technical official and attain further credentials for the benefit of swimming in the Area.

The Area also conducted a Meet Manager/Team Manager course which was well attended and thanks go to those who attend. A special thankyou needs to be extended to Cherry Smith and Matt Adair from the Swimming NSW office for their time and effort in conducting these courses.

The Area Championships both summer and winter were will attended by swimmers with many records broken; thanks must go to Dave Richards, the committee's appointments officer, for the work that he puts in to provide the necessary officials to man these championships.

Technical Committee;

I would like to express my appreciation to the members of the committee for their time and effort given over the season 2012/2013, for without their input the Area would not be in a position to effectively man swim meets. It is their time which is freely given that enables us to train, not only new official but also encourage officials to gain further credentials for the benefit of the Area.

SNSW D/O - CVSA AGM Report June 2013

1. **CVSA Management Committee and Standing Committees** - I would like to thank ALL CVSA management committee and standing committee coordinators and members for their time and efforts over the past 12 months in their respective positions. This also extends to the families of our committee members for being supportive and allowing them to attend the monthly meetings plus the many hours that are done outside of these times. They have all done a wonderful job in striving to keep Coast and Valley Swimming Association as the number one swimming area in the State.
2. **CVSA Technical Officials** – CVSA had a very busy 2012/13 season with over area 30 swim meets throughout the year. A big thank you to all CVSA officials who generously volunteered their time during the season.

Congratulations to the Technical committee for initiating the fabulous dinner held at the Gonyah Hotel in early May 2013. This was a successful idea to recognise the efforts of Technical officials who worked at most of our area swim meets.

I look forward to seeing most of you on pool deck again with some new faces hopefully appearing over the 2013/14 season.

3. **CVSA Swim Clubs Committee members** - All swim clubs committee members are to be congratulated on being actively involved in what I believe is one of the best sports in the world for their children to participate in. While most club committee members become involved in their respective clubs as parents just wanting to help out and lend a hand, it is important to recognise that by volunteering within your club, it enables our members to have a variety of swimming clubs to choose from catering to the individual needs of our members within Coast and Valley.
4. **Memberships and Registrations** – Coast and Valley Swimming Association had 4099 members register for the 2012/13 season which was around an 8% decline from last year, though CVSA still recorded the highest amount of swimming members in the state followed by Southern Inland then Metro South East.

Online registrations increased from 92 percent in 2011/12 season to 99 percent for the 2012/13 season which is a great effort by all swim clubs. Should any club or registrar require assistance with the membership process please contact myself or Michelle Kelly at SNSW.

5. **CVSA Information Guide February 2013** – The area information guide was reviewed and presented in February this year over 3 separate locations around the CVSA area. This areas where Mingara One, Maitland Sport and Recreation club and Edgeworth Bowling Club. Thank you to all those clubs who attended the sessions and to the Management committee members who attended on the 3 locations. Norm Roberts,

David Hinds, Russell Waugh and Jenny Schwetz. A special mentioned to the CVSA secretary Jenny Schwetz for assembling the manual.

The area Information guide includes Competition Policy, Development Squad Criteria, Application for Swim Meet and Technical Official information which can be found on the CVSA website under resources.

- 6. Competition / Development Strategy** - SNSW reviewed the Competition Strategy Policy which was approved early 2011. SNSW conducted extensive consultation with our stakeholders to ensure we got the document right, so the Policy will be able to provide positive outcomes for competition at all levels of our sport. SNSW are now undergoing a similar process as we review the Development Structure Policy and we expect that this will have similar outcomes for our development programs which should come into effect for the following season.

The inaugural Area 'B Squad' meet was held on the 5th of August at the Peninsula Leisure Centre at Woy Woy which was initiated by the Coast and Valley area. The concept behind the initiative was to provide a standalone competition for our adolescent swimmers who may not yet have reached their full potential to compete in a team environment and compete against other athletes of similar abilities from other areas. Competitors from the Metro South East, ACT, Coast and Valley, and South Eastern Areas competed for the 'B Squad Shield'.

All four Area's competed fiercely over a busy program including individual and relay events. Many of these athletes achieved personal best times which was a great achievement, particularly as many of our swimmers competed in up to 12 events on the day to help our team gain valuable points towards our teams score.

This initiative has continued again this year being held in Canberra by Swimming NSW

A gain a big thank you must go out to Coast and Valley Management Committee along with all of the Technical Officials and parents that officiated and made the day possible.

- 7. CVSA Website** – The CVSA website is continually being updated and has currently been operating successfully since January this year 2012. Thank you to Matt Frith for keeping the website up to date. If any clubs has any ideas on improving the website or wish to advertise club activities or events please contact CVSA secretary.

All policies, swim meets / results and development activities will be updated on the website on a regular basis. All CVSA members and swim clubs should refer to this site for various information and should save it as 'favourites' on your club or personal computers.

Club Websites - While it is has been pointed out that the free website provided by IMG may not the most user friendly website in creating a club site; Swimming

Australia has recognised this issue and employed someone specifically to assist swimming clubs with any website issues based out of the IMG office.

8. **CVSA Scholarship Coach** - CVSA offered a coaching scholarship program aimed at Bronze license coaches within the CVSA area. The CVSA scholarship program entitles up to two applicants the opportunity to gain their silver license coaching accreditation at the ASCTA conference on the Gold Coast. Michael Tattoli of KPD and Tom Davis of Nelson Bay were the successful applicants and attended the conference in early May. Both coaches with the CVSA Development Squads activities for the 2013 season.

Competition in the pool was high class and for many athletes a great lead up to NSW Country and State Age and Open Championships in July and August.

The nine years and under age group is always an exciting age group to watch as many of these swimmers are attending their first championships. The girls division was dominated by Hunter's Abigail Sweeney and KPD's Piper-Lily Walker.. The boy's competition was dominated by Charlie Hawke from Y Valley Aquatic with Toukley's Harrison Williams showing he will be a swimmer for the future.

The ten years age group was well contested in the boys between Mitch Robinson from Y Valley and Lachlan Braddish from Woy Woy. The girls division was dominated by Michaela Hazell from Hunter who broke 4 individual and 2 relay records.

The eleven years age group was dominated by KPD's Benjamin Yates who broke 3 individual records and 1 relay record. In the girls the competition was shared between Jade Frith of Novocastrian and Eden Leary of Gosford Stingrays

The twelve year age group was dominated by Kincumber Pacific Dolphins Ashleigh Power and Novocastrians Chloe Jones who broke 7 records between them. The boys division was a closely fought out competition between Zak Taylor of Y Valley Aquatic, Tristan Brooker of NuSwim and Harry Loader of KPD

The thirteen years age group was dominated by Australian Age medallist Bradley Woodward of Mingara Aquatic. Bradley broke 3 individual and 2 relay records. The girls division was dominated by Mingara Aquatic swimmer Odette Hodgson and Woy Woy's Rachel Wood. Both girls competed in many events over the course of the meet.

The fourteen year girls was totally dominated by multiple Australian Age Medallist Abbey Harkin of Novocastrian won the majority of her events, breaking 5 records. The boys competition was dominated by multiple Australian Age medallist Oliver Moody of NuSwim and Lachlan Vane-Tempest of Minagra Aquatic.

The fifteen years and over age group displayed high class competition. In the boys Ryan Leonard of Hunter broke 2 records outscoring his opposition. In the girls the Hunter's Meg Bailey – nine records and KPD's Cassandra van Breugel outscored their rivals.

At the end of the meet Coast and Valley Swimming Association President David Hinds presented the Swimmer of the Meet Awards. In the male competition Bradley Woodward of Mingara Aquatic scored 138 points and broke 3 individual records and 2 relay records. Bradley is such a committed young athlete who gives his very best in every race he contests. In second place was

Oliver Moody of Nu Swim who scored 129 points and broke 6 records. In third place was Hunter's Ryan Leonard who scored 125 points and broke 2 records.

In the female competition Meg Bailey from the Hunter club showed her class. Meg scored a massive 180 points and broke an incredible nine records. Meg displayed form in all disciplines over all distances. In second place was Abbey Harkin from Novocastrian who scored 147 points and broke five records. In third place was Mingara Aquatic's Odette Hodgson who scored 118 points.

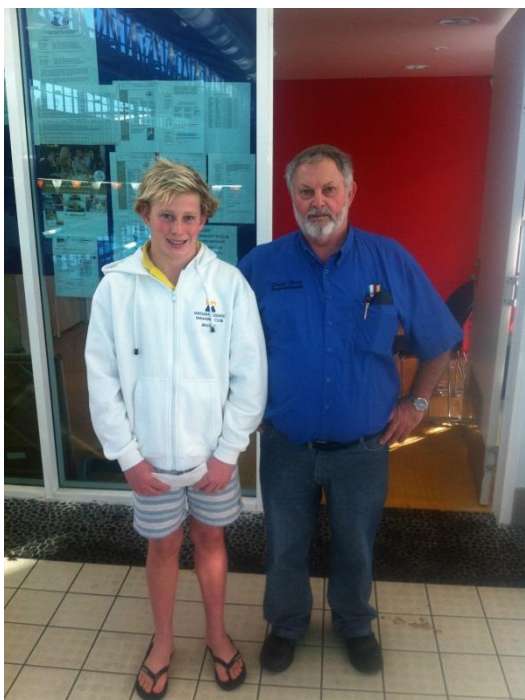
Overall a staggering 77 records were broken out of 140 events. In one race alone the top eight went under the previous record and all eight swimming under the State Age qualifying time.

At the end of the two days of competition Kincumber Pacific Dolphins were declared CVSA Club Champions for the first time scoring 1378.5 points, 2nd place to Hunter – 1359.5 points and 3rd place to Mingara Aquatic 1242.5 points.

Maddison Elliott who is only 13 years of age and still a student is a member of Novocastrian Club (Newcastle) and coached by Michael Legge and National Coast Brendan Keogh competed as a S8. S before the class represents Freestyle, Backstroke and Butterfly events and the 8 represents her impairment being 10 has the least impact on her ability to perform strokes and 1 has the greatest impact. SM before the class represents Individual Medley events. Maddison competed in the following events with wonderful results :-

Women's 400m Freestyle S8 – BRONZE MEDAL (3rd) in a time of 5:09.36

Women's 100m Butterfly S8 – Finalist – coming 6th in a time of 1:15.06

Women's 100m Backstroke S8 – Finalist – coming 6th in a time of 1:23.25

Women's 200m Individual Medley SM8 – Finalists coming 7th in a time of 2:59.26

Women's 4 x 100m Freestyle Relay – GOLD AND WORLD RECORD in a time of 4:20.39

Women's 50m Freestyle S8 – SILVER MEDAL (2nd) in a time of 31.44

Women's 100m Freestyle S8 – BRONZE MEDAL (3rd) in a time of 1:08.37

Our second swimmer is **Taylor Corry** who is 17 years of age and still a student is a member of Nelson Bay Club and is coached by Tom Davis competed as a S14. Class 14 is a swimmer with intellectual impairment. Taylor competed in the following events achieving these results :-

Women's 200m Freestyle S14 – SILVER MEDAL (2nd) in a time of 2:13.18

Women's 100m Breaststroke SB14 – ranked 6th in the Heats with a time of 1:30.89

Women's 100m Backstroke S14 – SILVER MEDAL (2nd) in a time of 1:09.46

Last but by no means least is **Teigan van Roosmalen** who is 21 years of age and is a member of Mingara Aquatic (Central Coast) and is coached by Graeme Carroll with Brendan Keogh her National Coach. Her occupation is athlete, lifeguard and student and has studied Massage Therapy at the Canberra Institute of Technology in Canberra where she was training. Her classification is S13 and competed in the following events with these results: -

Women's 50m Freestyle S13 – Finalist (6th) in a time of 29.40

Women's 100m Freestyle S13 – Finalist (7th) in a time of 1:04.87

Women's 100m Breaststroke SB13 – Finalist (7th) in a time of 1:24.03

Women's 200m Individual Medley SM13 – Finalist (6th) in a time of 2:35.61

All in all our three girls competed in 14 events making 13 finals bringing home 1 World Record, 1 Gold Medal, 3 Silver Medals and 2 Bronze Medals. This is a wonderful feat by our young girls who give it all and train hard.
